My brother bishops,

In preparation for the *Fortnight for Freedom: Witnesses to Freedom*, which will take place from June 21 to July 4, 2016, Conference staff has once again prepared materials that you and your diocesan staff may use to celebrate the Fortnight. This year's theme emphasizes the many witnesses to religious freedom, both past and present. Please see the revised <u>logo</u> incorporating this year's theme (in English and Spanish), which we would encourage you to use to promote this upcoming two-week period.

During the Fortnight, our liturgical calendar celebrates a series of great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power—St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More, St. John the Baptist, SS. Peter and Paul, and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome. In the secular calendar, we anticipate that the U.S. Supreme Court will rule at some point during the Fortnight (likely around June 27) on seven cases brought by religious non-profit entities, including the Little Sisters of the Poor, challenging the "accommodation" under the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services (HHS) contraceptive coverage mandate.

This year, we will have a special opportunity to encounter witnesses to freedom, as we have made arrangements with Stonyhurst College in England to bring **relics of St. Thomas More and St. John Fisher** to several cities throughout the United States so that the faithful may venerate these martyrs of the English Reformation. Once again, we are planning <u>two special Masses</u> to begin and end the Fortnight for Freedom. On **June 21** at 7 p.m. EDT, I will celebrate Mass at the Baltimore Basilica (America's First Cathedral) to begin the Fortnight. On **July 4** at noon EDT, Cardinal Donald Wuerl will celebrate Mass at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. Bishop David Zubik of Pittsburgh will be the homilist at the July 4 Mass. EWTN and CatholicTV will televise both Masses.
