

# Msgr. Paul McPartlan

is a priest of the Archdiocese of Westminster (UK) and Professor Emeritus of theology at The Catholic University of America. He studied Mathematics at Cambridge, philosophy and theology in Rome, and then gained his doctorate from Oxford in 1990. After several years in a London parish, he taught systematic theology at Heythrop College in the University of London from 1995 to 2005. From 2006 until December 2023, he was the Carl J. Peter Professor of Systematic Theology and Ecumenism at Catholic University in Washington DC. He served two terms on the International Theological Commission (2004-2009; 2009-2014). He participated in international Anglican-Roman Catholic dialogue, and was for ten years a member of the international Catholic-Methodist dialogue (2002-2012). Since 2005, he has been a member of the international Catholic-Orthodox theological dialogue. His books include The Eucharist Makes the Church: Henri de Lubac and John Zizioulas in Dialogue (1993). Sacrament of Salvation: An Introduction to Eucharistic Ecclesiology (1995), A Service of Love: Papal Primacy, the Eucharist, and Church Unity (2016), and he has written many articles on ecclesiology, ecumenism, and Vatican II. He also co-edited The Oxford Handbook of Ecumenical Studies (2021).



# Dcn. William T. Ditewig, Ph.D.

Born and raised in Peoria, Illinois, Bill joined the Navy post-college, serving in a variety of assignments around the world for 22 years, including as a Hebrew linguist. He received 14 awards during that time, including the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, the Navy Meritorious Service Medal, the Navy Commendation Medal, the National Defense Service Medal. the Navy Expeditionary Medal, and the Humanitarian Service Medal. He also served in a variety of lay ministries while in the Navy, and was ordained in 1990 for the Archdiocese of Washington. Since his retirement from the Navy in 1993, Bill has served as Associate Principal of a Catholic high school, Executive Director of the Office of the Diaconate, Washington, Director of Pastoral Services and Ministry Formation, Executive Director for the USCCB, Professor of Theology, and Director of Graduate Programs in Theology. He has a number of degrees and has authored numerous books, chapters, and articles. He is currently teaching at St. Leo University and serves as deacon at Our Lady of the Rosary in Land O'Lakes. He and his wife, Diann, have four children and 14 grandchildren.
