The St. John XXIII Residence at Angel Senior Living is one of 9 diocesan ministries that serve our priests, deacons, and lay leaders in their pastoral journey so they may continue offering our people the formation and foundation needed to bring God's message, mission, and ministry to our faith communities and world. Through the Catholic Ministry Appeal, this group of ministries will receive 44%, of the total \$9.5 million appeal goal to carry out their good works.



The St. John XXIII Residence is a new retirement home built by the Diocese of St. Petersburg in association with Angels Senior Living. It is open to priests, religious sisters, and Catholics who are disabled or in need, residing in Hillsborough, Hernando, Pasco, Pinellas, and Citrus Counties.

"This assisted living facility feels like a home, not an institution. The space is designed with the residents in mind, with attention to their needs as they age, so they will continue to be loved and cared for," said Monsignor Mike Muhr, who was appointed by Bishop Gregory Parkes to lead this initiative.

The newly constructed assisted living facility consists of 22 residences, offering studio, one-, and two-bedroom accommodations with kitchenettes, living rooms, and views of nearby woods. The residents will share a chapel for daily Mass, praying the

Rosary, spiritual devotions, and Bible study. A part-time Pastoral Services Coordinator will be available to support the spiritual growth and development of the residents.
